"We're the Carnations. We're here to play rock," announced the guitarist/ spokesperson as this young Southern Ontario quartet took the stage at the Bovine Sex Club Friday night. The music that followed proved to be as straightforward as that introduction. Opening with a quick three-song salvo, the band charged forward with their no-frills, shoe-gazer guitarrock, delivering a set that was satisfying in its freshness, if not overpowering in its dynamics. And though their vocal harmonies were sometimes a little out of tune, there was nothing truly cringe-worthy. After all, it's rock 'n' roll, not rocket science.
